


## HOW YOUR GIFT WILL HELP

# HOW TO LEAVE A GIFT IN YOUR WILL

Whether you wish to update an existing Will, or you are planning to write your first, remembering a charity is easy to do.
An up-to-date Will ensures your wishes for your loved ones and any charities you support will be clearly understood.

There are a few options you might consider. Once you have looked after those closest to you, you may wish to arrange for us to receive:

- A residuary gift made from whatever is left over once gifts of money and specific items have been distributed. You may choose to give the whole residue or a portion of it, to an individual or a charity.
- A pecuniary gift, which is a specific sum of money.
- A specific item, such as property, shares or personal items.

Many of our supporters choose to leave a small share of whatever is left after they have looked after those closest to them. This will ensure that the value of the gift is protected by inflation and that your loved ones will still receive what you intended.

If you would like to leave a gift in this way, the following wording can be adapted by your solicitor:

'I give to the Board of Trustees, the Science Museum Group of Exhibition Road, London SW7 2DD, on behalf of the National Railway Museum, Leeman Road, York, Y026 4XJ, [proportion of residue] for its general purposes and I direct that the receipt of the Treasurer or other duly authorised officer shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors.'

If you wish to make a gift in any other way, please refer to us in your Will as:

National Railway Museum, Leeman Road, York, YO26 4XJ

We always advise that you seek independent professional advice when writing your Will, to ensure that your estate will be distributed in accordance with your wishes.

If there is anything specific you are considering, please talk to us as we can offer you advice and support on how you can arrange your gift.
